To puff or not to puff was the question

Wenatchee North has been faced with several 'crucial' issues over the years, but one of the most devisive occured

when Joe Gaspers was president in 1979. It was at that time that 'wheezing' Wenatchee North board members put a smoking ban into effect during meetings. The 'puffing' had become intolerable in the enclosed, stuffy environ of the Chieftain meeting room, they claimed. Indignant cigarette, cigar and pipe puffers felt their God-given right to inflict lung damage on others was being infringed upon. The response overwhelmed the president - and the ban was rescinded by a vote of the membership in January of 1980.
