Delivering meals to those who need them



A drove of WNRotarians and guests were in attendance as Prez 'Alice' Ellis presented a few "tiddbits" about Rotary history. Prior to that, Gordi Northrup gave the shortest pre-meeting prayer in Wenatchee North history primarily so he could tell a story about a politician making the choice between heaven and hell. After choosing what

seemed to be the 'fun zone valhalla' of Hades, and discovering it wasn't what it was portrayed to be, Satan put it in terms the politician could understand, "Yesterday we were campaigning, today you voted." Treasurer Martin Barron stated that about half have paid dues so far and that "dues are due." Randy Zielinski made another pitch for Rotary Park tiles (lets get 'em purchased so Z-man doesn't feel so compelled).

Sandy Briggs of Mobile Meals presented the program. Mobile Meals began 40 years ago and were originally prepared by the chef at the old St. Anthony's Hospital with two dedicated volunteers delivering. Now, there are 180 volunteer drivers delivering to people of all ages. Each deliverer usually participates once a month. Approximately 75% of the program's income comes from meal recipients, but many are delivered free of charge. Most are short term recipients while recovering from hospitalization, treatment or surgery. Some, however, are long-term as a means of maintaining independant living. Last year, about 18,000 meals were served with the expectation of 19,000 in 2012. The meals are served hot at, or about, noon. Delivery is five days a week except Thanksgiving and Christmas. In some cases, the Mobile Meals delivery person is one of the few contacts that a recipient may have with the outside world.



 An interesting item in The Rotarian magazine...Rotarians have played an integral role in the "LN-4" Project", supported by the Ellen Meadows Prosthetic Hand Foundation, based in Ashland, OR. The foundation was launched by Ernie and Marj Meadows in memory of their daughter, Ellen, who died in an auto accident. Meadows, an industrial designer, developed a low-cost, light, durable, functional prosthesis to benefit people who have suffered hand amputation. The project's mission statement specifies that no one can profit from the production or distribution of the devices and that recipients can't be charged for them. Estimates are that at least 250,000 people worldwide are in need of

a prosthetic hand. Rotarians and others have distributed more than 8,200 in 57 countries since 2006. Rotarians, like Jim Yoder, travel on behalf of the project, at their own expense, to connect with local Rotarians and Rotaractors in thirdworld countries to enlist their help with distribution. Yoder described the experience of working with the LN-4 Project, "Each time we fit a hand, it makes my heart grow."
