

Prez Ellis gave kudos to Mike Lamey for getting the bills out for Sports Awards Illustrated advertising. It's a big job, made even bigger by ad sales people who may not have filled out their contact sheets including mailing addresses...99 advertisers this year generating

\$24,835 - 35 bucks more than last year, but \$3,540 less than our record sales in 2007.

Mayoral candidates stated their cases at the meeting with KPQ news director Steve Hare again present - Frank Kuntz: Doesn't think gambling will do much to fix

any of the city's financial issues - hasn't generated much in tax revenue for East Wenatchee - but the citizens can vote on it. Concept of a Metro Park District is good to provide maintenance as TTC eats up funds. Doesn't believe legally that city is on the hook for anything more than interest on TTC debt so, technically, it would be the PFD defaulting. The legal process will define the city's obligation. However, on Jan. 1, major cuts will be implemented out of necessity. Shiloh Schauer: Gambling wouldn't be a silver bullet. Rather than sticking a finger in the dike, need to have a plan and is hesitant to ask people for additional taxes unless there's a vision. Believes in regional strength. Ask the people, "Do you want the TTC?" If so, then we need to come together to find a regional solution. Default is a catalyst for additional problems. Jesse Widby: Doesn't believe gambling is the solution, but let voters decide. Taxing of any kind is up to the people. Default is a last resort, but still an option. TTC's fate isn't really up to the City of Wenatchee - the PFD owns the building. Not concerned about building a "monument" as his legacy, although a new fire station would be nice.
