The WNR Board of Directors held their monthly meeting on August 22nd at Cafe AZ's with Mahatma presiding and Steve Ellis, Fred Van Sickle, Bealinda Brady and Steve Tidd, along with observer Jeff Mertes,

attending. Treasurer Tidd announced that after liabilities are paid, including college scholarships, the bank balance is slightly more than \$25,000. In addition, there are still \$3,595 outstanding in Sports Awards advertising and \$1,590 to be collected in dues. Tidd will check with Jim Haglund to determine if any ticket obligations exist.

A discussion ensued regarding projects to donate to in the upcoming year including WVC scoreboard, funding construction of another house in Estele, Nicauragua, and supporting the Guatamalean Literacy program. Mertes pointed out that with the implementation of the committee structure, Ways & Means would be involved with vetting programs to support, as well as potential fundraisers. The W&M committee then would make recommendations to the president and board. Other committees would be involved in various aspects of the club in a similar manner.

There was also a discussion about a "corporate" membership for WVC to include certain members of the athletic department as well as the student body president that will require the participation of the membership committee. Defining the responsibilities and expected participation of new forms of membership will also need to be defined by the committee.
