Rotary District Governor Gary Hollingshead was scheduled to address WNR, but had to cancel so Senator Linda Parlette pinch hit at the podium. A Rotarian since 1993, she personally sees tremen-

dous value in being a member of Rotary. The meetings, whether in Olympia or here in Wenatchee, provide a welcome respite from the hectic environment of state governance and gives her a chance to "get out" and "keep in touch" with what is going on - her connection with the real world. Parlette said that an aspect of being a state senator, few people realize, is that she is basically working most of the time - for a bargain salary of just \$42,000 per year. She now chairs the Republican caucus of the senate as well as serving on several important committees including Ways & Means as the ranking minority member of Capital Budget, and Health & Long-Term Care. Parlette is also a member of the Washington State Debt Commission. In the last session, she sponsored a law that passed unanimously in the Senate reforming Washington State Medicaid. As to future plans, she says she takes it year-to-year. Typically, when the political grind of a session ends, she wonders if it's worth it. Then, the spirit of service rekindles and she's ready for another round.

Have we become 'old fogies'?

Read Rotary International President Kalyan Banerjee's letter in the September issue of *The Rotarian* and realize that the average age of members of the organization is creeping ever higher. Wenatchee North, once the "Young men's Rotary Club", is skipping into the sunset as well.

President Banerjee notes some alarming statistics regarding the current age of Rotarians worldwide - only 11% under 40, 89% over 40, 68% over 50 and 39% over 60.

As aged as those figures indicate, the situation is even more decrepit in WNR where the average age of members is now about 58. The club's under 40 membership is only 6%, over 40 is 94%, over 50 is 83% and over 60 is a whopping 56%. That's why "The future is now" for our membership drive. Banerjee concludes, "We owe it to our Rotary family - past, present, and

future - to make sure that our generation of Rotarians is not the last.
